***Alicia Kozakiewicz.*** Alicia became the victim of an Internet luring. The predator transported her to another state and there, for four terrifying days, held her captive. Alicia has worked to help ensure that no other child suffers her traumatic experiences. She created an Internet Safety Program, the AliciaProject, Her story and insight have been featured as part of Internet Safety programs across the nation, and internationally in magazines including *People* and *Cosmopolitan*, in hope of raising awareness.

## **OTHER NATIONAL PRESENTERS**

**Dr. Peter Collins.** Dr. Collins is a Canadian forensic psychiatrist. He is an expert on violent crime and has worked with criminal justice agencies in Canada and throughout the world, including INTERPOL, the FBI and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, the Australian Federal Police and Europol. He frequently testifies as an expert witness on sexual homicide, pedophilia, child pornography, stalking, sexual assault, paraphilias, the insanity defense, suicide by cop, police crisis negotiations and post-traumatic stress disorder.

**Dr. James Reese.** Dr. Reese is an internationally known, award winning authority in the areas of leadership, stress management, violence, motivation, criminal profiling, and related topics. He has provided expert testimony before the United States Congress and addressed the President of the United States' Council on Integrity and Efficiency. Weaving his powerful anecdotes of 25 years of experience as an FBI "Mind Hunter," together with over 10 years as CEO of James T. Reese and Associates, Dr. Reese brings the latest information on the topic to the podium and provides "life-changing" presentations. He works tirelessly to share what he has taught to tens of thousands of listeners worldwide.

**William Daniels.** Daniels has served as the Law Enforcement Coordinator/Community Resource Specialist for the United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Florida since 1998. In this capacity, he advises the United States Attorney on law enforcement and community-related matters, assists in the coordination of specialized law enforcement and community-based initiatives (including multiple high-crime areas; Drug Education for Youth programs; Anti-Gang Initiatives; and Firearms Violence Reduction strategies).

**Steven DeBrotta.** DeBrotta has served as an Assistant United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana since 1991. He specializes in computer crime, political corruption, complex fraud cases and environmental crime. He is also the Special Emphasis Coordinator for child exploitation cases. He is an expert in the investigation and prosecution of crimes on the Internet and the use of computer forensic evidence. He has trained agents, prosecutors and members of the public locally, nationally, and internationally. He received the US DOJ Director's Award in 2000 for Superior Performance.

## **OTHER NATIONAL PRESENTERS**

**Joelle H. Fisher.** Fisher is a Senior Intelligence Analyst Trainer for Man Tech Telecommunications and Information Systems Corporation at the National Drug Intelligence Center (NDIC). She has over 20 years of experience in military and law enforcement intelligence. Fisher has taught a various law enforcement agencies in over 40 states and in Canada for such agencies as the U.S. Department of Defense, FBI, DEA, ATF, Gang Investigators Associations, Professional Fire and Fraud Investigators Association, Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), and various US Attorney's Offices and High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTAs).

**Fanny Haselbacher.** Haselbacher is an attorney with the DOJ Office on Violence Against Women (OVW). She is detailed to OVW from the FBI's Office of the General Counsel where she has served as an Assistant General Counsel for 10 years. She specializes in legal issues relating to the Gun Control Act, the Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act, the Violence Against Women Act, and the criminal record and other information systems maintained by the FBI such as the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS), the Interstate Identification Index (III), and the National Crime Information Center 2000 (NCIC).

**Richard A. Hobson.** Hobson is a Lieutenant (retired) in the Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, DC. As commander of Operation Ceasefire, he directed the daily operations of a nationally recognized anti-gun-violence task force, credited as one of the first and most successful of its type to specifically target gang and gun-related violence through street-level firearms interdiction and investigation. The task force recovered over 1,300 crime guns and made 3,500 arrests. Hobson has developed and administered several U.S. Department of Justice sponsored Gun Recovery and Enforcement Training Program seminars designed to enhance law enforcement's ability to successfully detect and recover unlawfully possessed crime guns and strengthen firearms case articulation and preparation toward successful criminal prosecutions.
